



Pinellas Schools Referendum Renewal in November

Since 2004, voters have regularly approved a $\frac{1}{2}$ mill property tax to enhance Pinellas school funding. The next renewal is on this November's ballot.

The ballot language **REQUIRES** this money be spent to recruit and retain quality teachers, preserve reading programs and music and art classes, and provide current textbooks and technology.

In 2019, the average single-family homeowner paid less than \$86, producing \$44.5 million for our schools.

The Referendum provides a dedicated local source of funding over and above State monies. Every penny benefits Pinellas students and spending is monitored by an independent citizen oversight committee.

A YES vote will renew the tax for four more years.

A NO vote will stop the additional funding to our schools.
